

# Rollback of progress against oppression

MNS was a pioneer in the anti-oppression training now identified with DEI - Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.

We were almost unique in including classism, and <u>ex-MNSers</u> co-founded several economic justice groups, United for a Fair Economy, Class Action and Inequality.org



Now DEI is under attack, being banned and even criminalized by state and federal governments, and used as an excuse to cut back on science, the arts and education.

Interviews with 50+ conservatives about racism and sexism showed surprising complexity.

Some did speak up against the narrow forms of racism they recognized.

### How do we relate to white Trump voters?




Assuming they are all racist *reduces* the possibility of coalitions with surprising allies facing cuts:

- Farmers
- Veterans
- Federal workers
- Sheriffs

Movements grow when there are coalitions of unlikely allies, and well-targeted campaigns that draw them in

One 2024 study showed that about 27% of white workers say DEI is a bad thing - nowhere near a majority! Lots of neutrals.
